
develop and enrich its religious life.

The four interrelated components: Religious Identity and Culture; Evangelisation and Faith Formation; Prayer and Worship and Social Action and Justice provide an important focus for the development of the religious life of our community. They are reflected in the following ways:



Evangelisation and Faith Formation at Star of the Sea

- Strong links with St Joseph's Catholic Parish is present where there are many opportunities for staff and students to celebrate and participate in Mass at one of the three churches in the parish.
- Whole school masses, liturgies and celebrations throughout the year. When these are small gatherings, there is the opportunity to celebrate these events in the School Chapel.
- Sacramental programs, while parish based, are jointly led by parish and school staff.
- Focus on spiritual growth during Lent and Advent (participating in making Lenten promises, Stations of the Cross, Nativity Play)
- Student spirituality focus daily classroom prayer, prayer assemblies, retreats and reflection days (Catching Fire Workshops), classroom meditation, camp liturgies.
- Use of the Chapel for prayer opportunities.
- Community Celebrations including Mother's day, Father's Day, Grandparent's Day, and weekly class prayer assemblies.
- Exploring the values and messages contained within the school Charism – Faith, Community, Compassion and Comittment.
- Students involved as altar servers and readers for school celebrations
- Year 6 students attending mass at St Peter the Fisherman Community Church at Burrum Heads and St Patrick's at Howard.
- Year 5 students attending St Mary of the Cross Mass at St Joseph's.
- Year 4 students attending healing masses at St Joseph's.



Religious Identity and Culture at Star of the Sea

- Mini Vinnies and Winter Sleepout.


